to all who shall see these presents greeting:

Know ye, That, expressing special trust and confidence in the Fidelity, Ability and Diligence of  
Spencer C. Young, of New York, I have Nominated, and by and with the advice and consent of the Senate,  
do appoint him Marshal of the United States, in and for the Eastern District of New York,  
and do authorize and empower him to execute and fulfil the duties of that Office according to Law and to have  
and to hold the said Office, with all the powers, privileges and emoluments to the same of right appertaining unto him the said  
Spencer C. Young, for the term of four years, commencing with the date hereof,  
subject to the conditions prescribed by law.

In Testimony Whereof, I have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the Seal  
of the Department of Justice to be hereunto affixed

Done at the City of Washington this sixteenth day of June  
in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and forty-two and of the  
Independence of the United States of America the one hundred and sixty-sixth.
